

**A RESOLUTION NO. 10-03 BY THE JAMES ISLAND PUBLIC SERVICE DISTRICT
COMMISSION: McLEOD PLANTATION, OUR HERITAGE**

Adopted February 8, 2010

WHEREAS the James Island Public Service District Commission (the governing body of the James Island Public Service District established in 1961) is composed of duly elected representatives of the citizens of James Island and serves over 22,000 such citizens, it is appropriate for the Commission to state an official position on important issues affecting those citizens; and

WHEREAS there is among James Islanders a strong sense of community that is manifest, among other ways, in how they cherish their heritage; and

WHEREAS the historic McLeod Plantation is one of, if not the, most significant manifestations of James Islanders' heritage; and

WHEREAS the Friends of McLeod has worked and continues to work diligently to preserve McLeod Plantation for future generations of James Islanders in, essentially, its present state; and


WHEREAS the Friends of McLeod feels the Charleston County Park and Recreation Commission would be an ideal steward of McLeod Plantation not only for James Islanders, but also for all other residents of Charleston County,

BE IT RESOLVED, the James Island Public Service District Commission urges all entities and all individuals with an interest in McLeod Plantation, to cooperate with each other to the end that the Charleston County Park and Recreation Commission purchase the property at the earliest possible date.
